Nottingham (6-3) also has a holiday weekend contest to end its season when it plays at Notre Dame (4-5) at 7 p.m. tomorrow at Msgr. Walter Nolan Stadium.

For Allentown and Northern Burlington, tonight's game is a chance to wipe away the sting of their loss to Neptune. The Shore Conference club needed overtime to get past Allentown, 40-33, then went to Columbus and erupted in a 60-27 rout of Northern Burlington.

"Neptune is a very tough team, but Northern was the No. 1 seed in our division (C.J. III). Neptune played very well that night, but Northern Burlington is very good."

Good enough to win eight straight after an opening loss at Princeton, while Allentown was on a five-game win streak that included victories over unbeaten New Egypt and West Windsor South in consecutive games.

"It's a big game for us and a big game for our program, and on a big weekend for football," said Graber.

Both offenses feature 1,000-yard players with Tosin Adeyemo pacing NB's offense with 1,446 yards and 20 TDs on 227 carries, while junior quarterback Nick Palladino tops the Redbirds with 1,239 yards and 14 TD throws on 54 percent completions (94-for-174) and 7 INTs.

Norman Williams (128-739, 7 TDs) is the run threat for Allentown, while Colin Fitzpatrick (51-85-2, 825 yards, 8 TDs) is the QB who runs Northern's offense.

If this game stays tight like Allentown's previous game was a key could be the leg of Markus Collin, who has hit four field goals this fall, including a pair of game-winners.
